Applications Review / Discussion

Event: Fremont Solstice Parade & Celebration

Date(s): Saturday, June 18, 2022
Location: Fremont and Gas Works Park
Organizer(s): Maque daVis; Darren Linker

Event Notes:

- Event returning after a "hibernation" during the pandemic; last event was in 2019
- Will revise COVID mitigation plan as needed
- Working with the Fremont Fair and the business chamber and other partners
- Funding is an issue at this time the organization has not received revenue in the past two years;
 working to apply for grants but have lost much of their individual supporters due to changing conditions in the community and an aging population
- Using previous route from 39th and Leary to Gas Works Park; there is some construction at parade start, but working with contractors
- 1:00 PM parade start; streets will be shut down at 12:30 to allow time for clearing
- No significant changes to celebration in the park; hoping to have a pageant of costumed artists
- Planning for more volunteers to assist with COVID requirements; requesting all participants present vaccination documentation
- Current King County vaccination verification order is set to expire on March 16; SEO staff will work with organizer to update plans after that time
- Celebration includes a beer garden that is fenced; prefer to not have to fence off whole park as it is a public park and cost prohibitive
- Stage in park is 12x16 feet by 2 feet tall, not fenced
- Expecting 5 food trucks

Committee Discussion:

- Parks The east entrance of the park will be under construction, need to adjust plan for load-in; will discuss a plan for electrical power and removing bollards
- SPOC Police staffing is not available on this day due to conflicting events, may be able to work out a plan with additional security staffing and/or fencing; need to continue discussion separately

Event: Lunar New Year Celebration Date(s): Saturday, March 26, 2022

Location: Hing Hay Park and nearby streets
Organizer(s): Connie Au-Yeung; Monisha Singh

Event Notes:

- Originally scheduled for February 5; postponed to April 30 due to COVID concerns
- 11AM-4PM
- Line S King St with food and craft vendors
- Will have program of celebratory performances in Hing Hay Park
- Will be verifying vaccination of volunteers and staff
- Not adding any additional seating to park; will use existing furniture
- No pyrotechnics/fireworks; will be open flame cooking but no open flame performances
- 30-40 food vendors, primarily along S King St, will spread out booths more than previously for air flow and safety
- Tent near stage is two 10x10 tents together; no canopy or covering on stage

Committee Discussion:

- Fire Prevention Requests revised map to show 10x10 tents
- SDOT using same traffic control plan as previous event
- Parks No concerns

Late Fees

Chris Swenson, Chair

- In August 2021, the committee approved a proposal to temporarily waive late fees for applications for events through December 31, 2021
- The waiver was intended to provide support to events as they began to reopen, with acknowledgement that the changing requirements made it difficult to plan in advance
- The committee may want to consider extending this waiver
- Fee is intended to encourage organizers to turn applications in on time; due to limited resources in SPD, may want to continue practice
- Could consider a short-term extension
- Important to get the word out to organizers regarding the extra time that is currently needed for coordination, especially due to police staffing constraints
- SDOT would prefer just denying late applications; fee seems to have little effect
- Committee would like more feedback from SPD before making a decision
- Also important to inform organizers of any changes to our current practices with regards to denying late applications; RSJ lens must be used in considering
- Fire Prevention recommends a "tiered" approach to charging late fees vs outright denial based on application late fee
