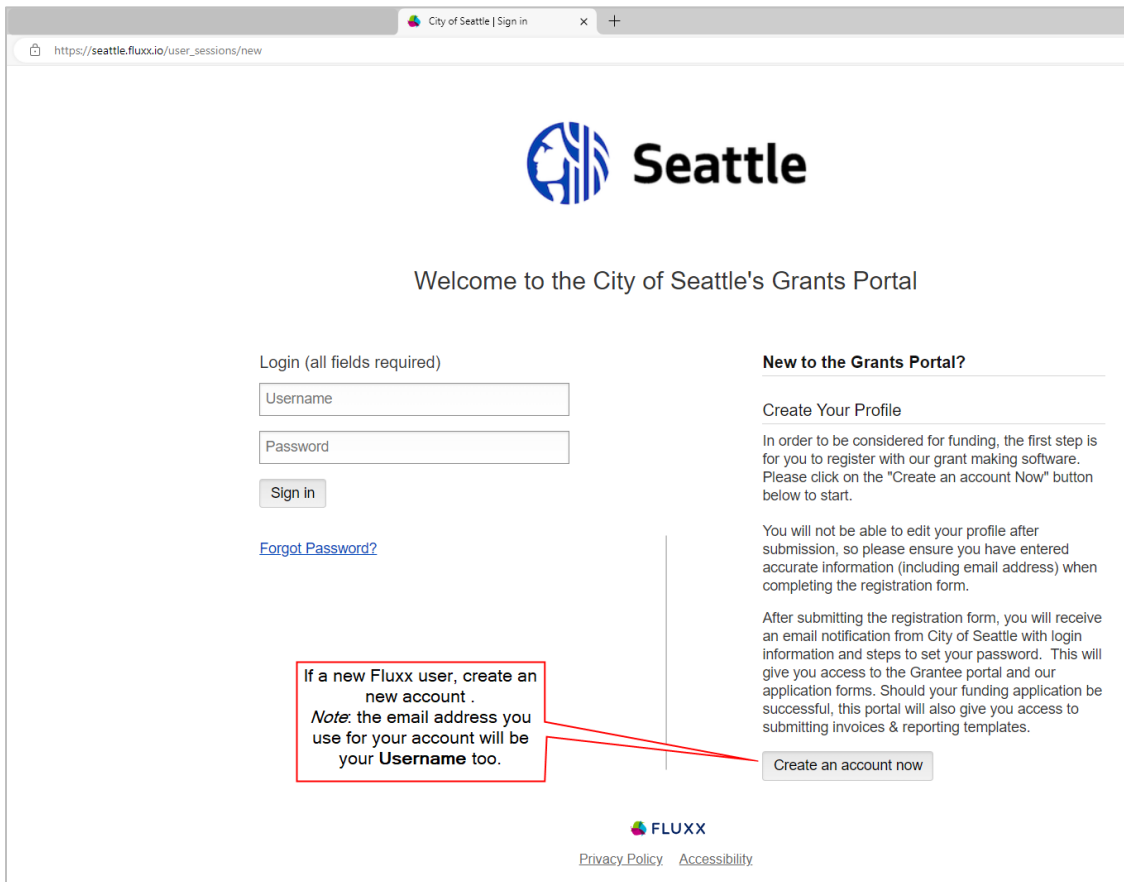

HOW TO USE THE PORTAL

Digital Equity Grants

Grants aim to increase internet access and adoption through:

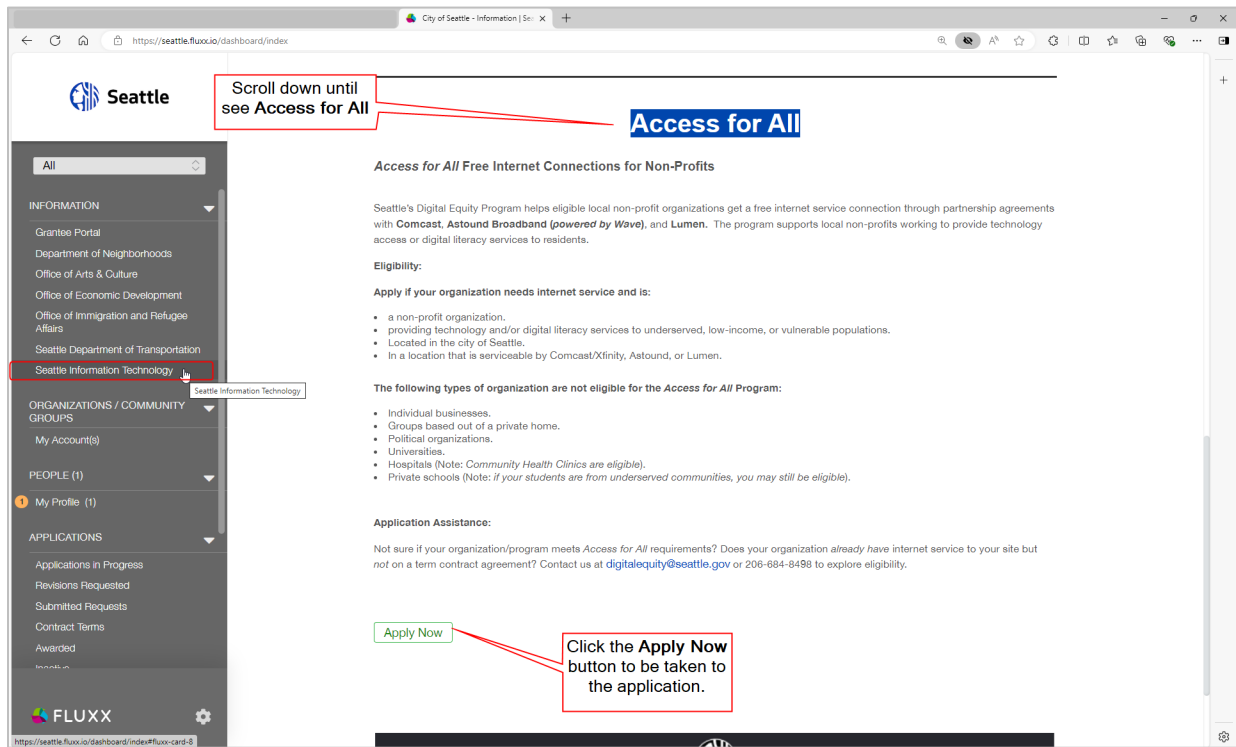
- Digital literacy classes and/or workshops: Provide digital literacy skills training to new technology users.
- Devices and technical support: Provide devices (for example: laptops, Chromebooks, tablets, desktop computers, smartphones, assistive technology) and the support needed to use them effectively.
- Internet connectivity: Provide internet to low-income residents by expanding WiFi or another means (for example: hotspots, routers, or WiFi access points).
- Digital navigator services: Provide one-on-one or small group, just-in-time assistance in person, virtually, via phone/text/email to help residents (1) use their devices (computers, laptops, and smartphones); (2) connect to the internet; and (3) sign up for low-cost internet plans.

TECHNOLOGY MATCHING FUND projects may include a combination of the above digital equity categories. The primary focus of the project must be one of the following: (1) **digital literacy classes and/or workshops**; (2) **devices and technical support**; or (3) **internet connectivity**.

DIGITAL NAVIGATOR GRANT projects provide **digital navigator services**. Your project may include other digital equity components (digital literacy classes and/or workshops; devices and technical support; or internet connectivity), but the majority of your budget will be allocated to digital navigator services. Grants will be awarded to organizations committed to delivering digital navigator services in partnership with the City to accomplish the following:

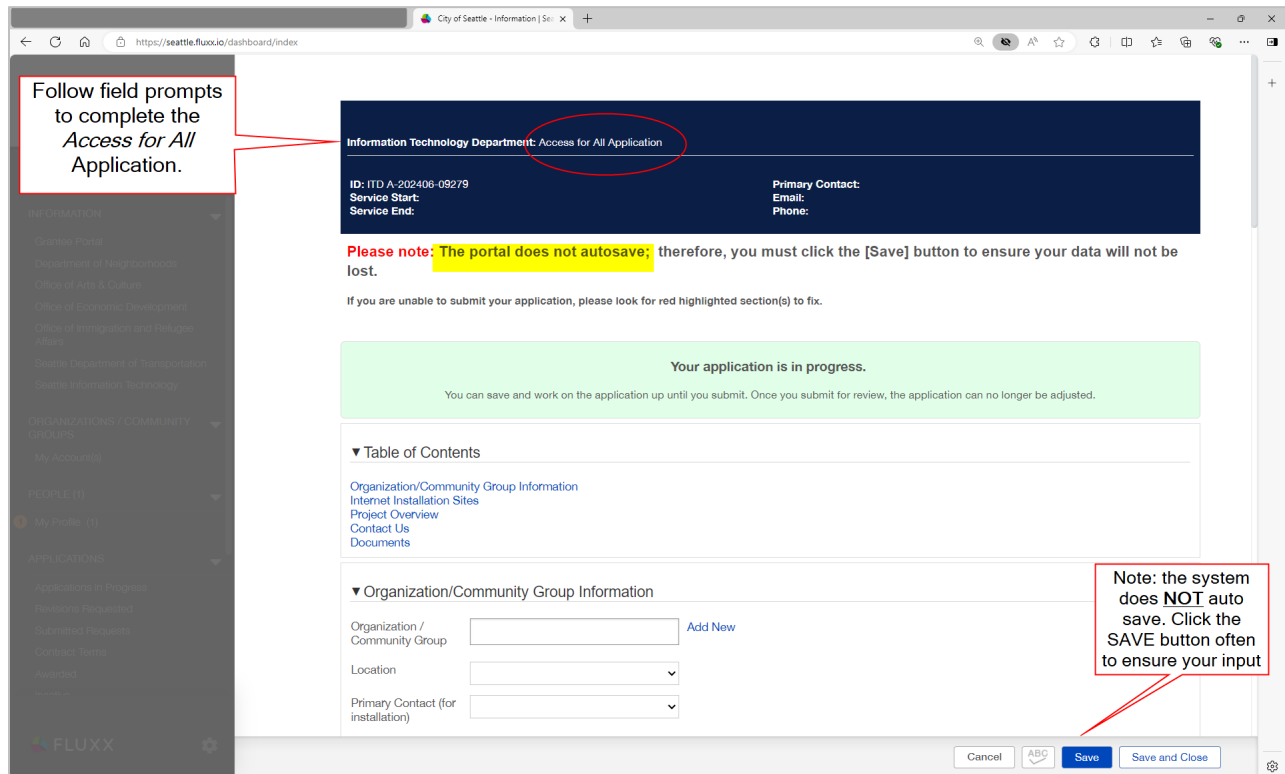
Scroll down *through the Seattle Information Technology* page until see **Access for All**.

Click **Apply Now** Button to go to on-line application form.

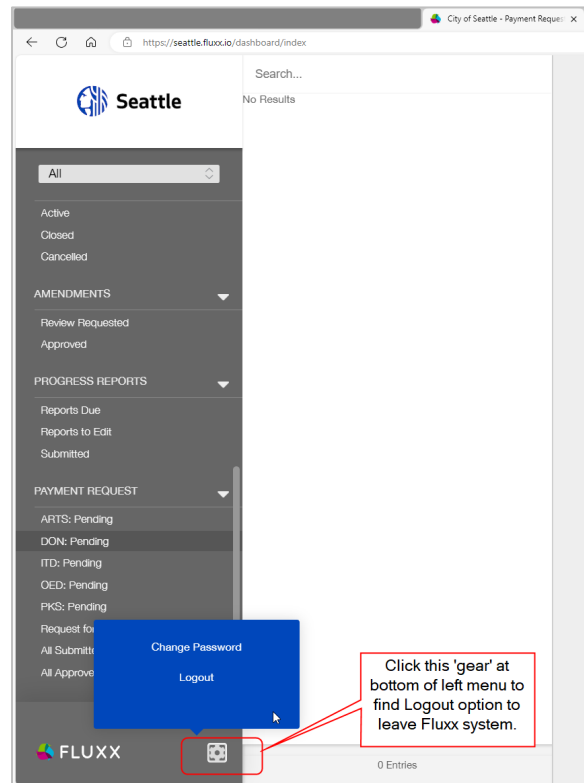


Complete the Access for All Application form.
