Through Trees for Neighborhoods, you receive:

- Free trees for your yard and street*
- Mulch and a watering bag for each tree
- Training on proper planting and care
- Ongoing care reminders

- Workshop opportunities on young tree pruning and planting site selection
- Assistance applying for street tree planting permit

*Up to 3 per household, lifetime maximum of 6 trees



Planting a Street Tr

Tree lined streets fill a neighborhood wit grace and beauty. To make sure street t are placed in the correct spot, a free per is required from the Seattle Department Transportation. We will apply for this per on your behalf when you participate in T for Neighborhoods. Just be sure to indic that you are planting street trees on your application.





4 STEPS TO PLANTING:

- Evaluate your planting site and select a tree suited to the space. Attend a tree and site selection workshop for free advice.
- Apply for trees this summer. Due to the popularity of Trees for Neighborhoods, the application is a lottery. Not everyone who applies will receive trees. Application information can be found at

www.seattle.gov/trees/planting-and-care/trees-for-neighborhoods

- If selected, attend a planting workshop in the fall to learn how to introduce your trees to their new home. We will deliver the trees to your home.
- After we deliver your trees, plant them within a month. We will keep in touch with care reminders and workshop opportunities.
