FILM INCENTIVE FUNDING INCREASE NOT INCLUDED IN STATE'S 2016 BUDGET

WASHINGTON FILMWORKS

The bill to increase Washington's Motion Picture Competitiveness Program (SB 6027) was not included in the final state budget signed by Governor Inslee this week. While the outcome is not what we hoped for, we are convinced that the film community's efforts raised the industry's profile in Olympia and beyond. Washington Filmworks will host post-legislative session debrief events in Seattle and Spokane. The non-inclusion of SB 6027 does not impact the state's current Motion Picture Competitiveness Program, which maintains its \$3.5 million annual budget through 2017.


