#### Office of Labor Standards

The mission of the Seattle Office of Labor Standards (OLS) is to advance labor standards through thoughtful community and business engagement, strategic enforcement, and innovative policy development with a commitment to race and social justice.

#### Opportunity

OLS seeks to partner with organizations or grassroots groups that have existing relationships in communities of color. OLS has one-time funds to support **community organizing projects** that will help to build wider and deeper connections with **domestic workers** in **communities of color** to understand their **domestic worker rights in Seattle**. Preference will be given to projects that use a clear organizing strategy (e.g., peer-to-peer), involve mutually benefiting partnerships, and/or build relationships in Asian/Pacific Islander and Black/African Descent communities.

### Eligibility

This opportunity is open to nonprofit organizations in the greater Seattle area OR grassroots groups that have fiscal sponsorship with a nonprofit organization in the greater Seattle area.
