



### THE VISION

To galvanize, educate and unite students and people experiencing homelessness in order to end the many inequalities that perpetuate homelessness and other forms of oppression.



#### WHAT DOES **HOSTING TC3 LOOK LIKE?**


- → 90 days
- → ~10,000 sq ft (lawn, parking lot)
- → 100 residents (families, men, women)
- → 24/7 in-house security (check-in desk only entry/exit)
- → Bring own portable shower, Honey Buckets, and kitchen
- → Quiet hours: 9 PM 8 AM
- **Self-governed community** (litter patrol, education outreach, advocacy)
- → Strict rules sobriety, no violence, no drugs
- → Eligibility is based on government-issued photo ID
