## Code Issue:

Can the separation between exit doors or exit access doorways be measured along a direct line of travel along an exterior exit balcony?

## Interpretation:

Yes. However, where the open sides of exterior exit balconies are exposed to each other, the balconies shall be located as per Section 1026.5 from an assumed property line between them.
