General comment	Response
Expand Priority Investment Network (PIN)	Kept the PIN based on walksheds to public schools and frequent transit
Plan doesn't describe the growth in walking	Added discussion on growth in walking to the introduction
How do planning efforts fit together?	Added text of other planning efforts to policy framework section
Include more information about pedestrian system needs	Added discussion of pedestrian assets, their condition, and related maintenance needs
Be realistic about funding outlook	Acknowledged pedestrian needs outweigh available funding
Comments on strategies/actions	Revised or added several strategies and actions based on public comment
Specific location improvement	Following up on safety concerns outside of the Plan

Other plan changes:

- Council direction for additional performance measure targets
- Updated maps to reflect network corrections

- Council adoption anticipated March 2017
