Safety and access improvements in play area and open space on N 35th St and Woodlawn Ave N

Overview

Contractors for Seattle Public Utilities will be working on reducing sidewalk sloping at the Carr Place and Woodlawn Open Spaces to address Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. Pavement at the basketball court will be changed to standard concrete. There will also be new handrails installed along some of the walkways, improving access for all users. Work is expected to start on Monday, October 8 and continue through December. We will try to open up individual areas (like the playground) as soon as they are fully completed.

What to expect

- As early as Monday, October 8, the contractor will mobilize equipment to prepare for the work.
 Normal working hours will be Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Periodically, during working hours, N 35th St between Woodlawn Ave N and Carr PI N, will be narrowed to one lane. Flaggers will direct local traffic to alternating one-way travel.
- Periodically, during working hours, parking will be impacted on N 35th St and Woodlawn Ave N.
- Neighbors can expect noise, dust, and some minor traffic delays during working hours.
- Much of the public space including the fitness equipment will be closed for the duration of the construction and the work areas will be surrounded by temporary fencing. The southern portion of Woodlawn Open Space near N 34th St should remain accessible.





In December 2016, SPU opened the new North Transfer Station, a more effective and efficient facility that is helping the City reach its zero-waste goal. The new facility was designed with significant community input and incorporates many features that reduce traffic congestion, noise, and odor.
