### We make technology work for the City

The Department of Information Technology's mission is to make technology work for the City. We make sure that computer systems run smoothly to allow you to access City services online, like buying permits and



licenses, applying for jobs, and paying parking tickets. We also run emergency radio, telephone and email systems.



#### Office of Cable Communications

The City has cable television franchise agreements with Comcast and Broadstripe. We administer the Cable Customer Bill of Rights to make sure that everyone gets competent, responsive service from the cable companies.

#### Seattle Channel

The Seattle Channel (cable Channel 21) airs television programs to help people in Seattle connect with City government. Shows include City Council meetings, neighborhood events, and local arts and cultural events. The shows are also available on the Internet at www.seattlechannel.org.
